One win away from clinching a USL W League playoff berth, Aurora FC welcomes rivals River Light FC to TCO Stadium for its final home fixture of 2026. Saturday's clash marks a rematch from May, a 2-0 Aurora win.

River Light come into the weekend second in the Heartland Division table, leapfrogging Sioux Falls City courtesy of a 4-1 win over RKC Third Coast. The visitors have scored 13 total goals over their last four matches, going 3-1-0 in that stretch of play.

Minnesota Gopher Caroline Birdsell leads RLFC with 3 goals this season.

By the Numbers:

EAGAN, Minn. - Minnesota Aurora FC scored a pair of early first-half goals on its way to a 2-0 win over Sioux Falls City FC on Wednesday night at TCO Stadium. Ai Kitagawa scored her team-leading ninth goal of the season and Maia Tabion tallied her third goal of the campaign. Minnesota (9-0-0, 27pts) remains unbeaten, extending its lead atop the Heartland Division to 11 points over Sioux Falls (5-2-1, 16pts) with three matches remaining in the regular season.

Aurora took an early lead in the sixth minute through Kitagawa. Off a throw-in by Thalia Morisi, Kitagawa received the ball, turned and dribbled toward the top of the box before releasing a long-range strike that the Sioux Falls goalkeeper was not able to handle.

Minnesota doubled its lead less than two minutes later this time it was Tabion getting on the scoresheet. Flavie Dubé settled a long ball played over the top to her in space before slotting a ball across the face off the goal for Tabion, who converted into an open net from the top of the six-yard box in the eighth minute.

Carrying a balanced attack this season, Aurora has had 12 different goal scorers, including eight different players with multiple goals. Minnesota has scored 29 goals this season, and has scored multiple goals in seven of its nine matches this season.

Aurora also extended their shutout streak to nine games as they remain the only team in the W League that has not conceded a goal this season. Goalkeeper Taylor Fox recorded her fifth shutout of the season.

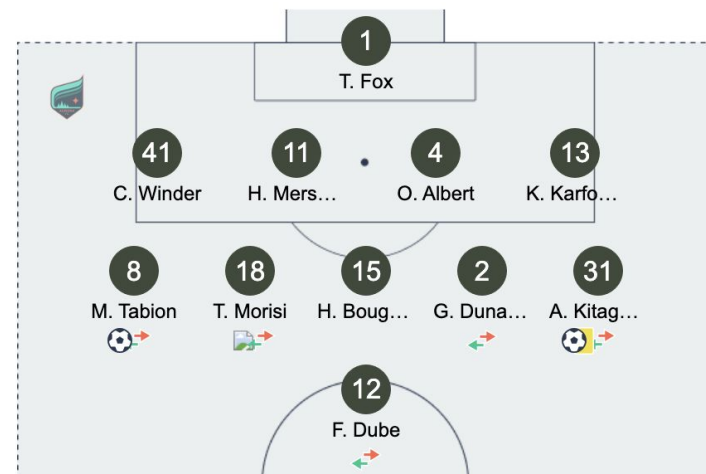

AURORA, Ill. – Minnesota Aurora FC, in the finale of its three-match road trip, defeated division rivals River Light FC, 2-0, Saturday afternoon at Fichtel Field.

The win moves Aurora FC to 4-0-0 on the season. Courtesy of Aurora's win and Edgewater Castle's loss to Rochester FC, Aurora now claims sole possession of the top spot in the Heartland Division table.

Aurora came out of the gates firing, earning a pair of corners and three attacking half free kicks across the opening 22 minutes of the contest.

Aurora continued to ask questions of River Light as the half carried on, and in the 28th minute, the visitors found their answer.

In the 28th minute, Aurora drove down the far-left flank, finding Thalia Morisi in space. The Long Islander would help set up an overlapping run, dishing to Talia Coury on the edge of the penalty area, who found Gracie Dunaway racing down the channel. Dunaway played the ball back into the area, picking out Maia Tabion who nodded it past RLFC's Alyssa Gluting to make it 1-0.

Aurora FC would salt away the remainder of the opening half, taking a 1-0 lead into the intermission for the third straight match.

The second half was no different for Aurora, who established possession and rhythm from the opening whistle in Illinois. In the 63rd minute, Skye Leach found a goal off a corner to make it 2-0 and put the contest to rest.

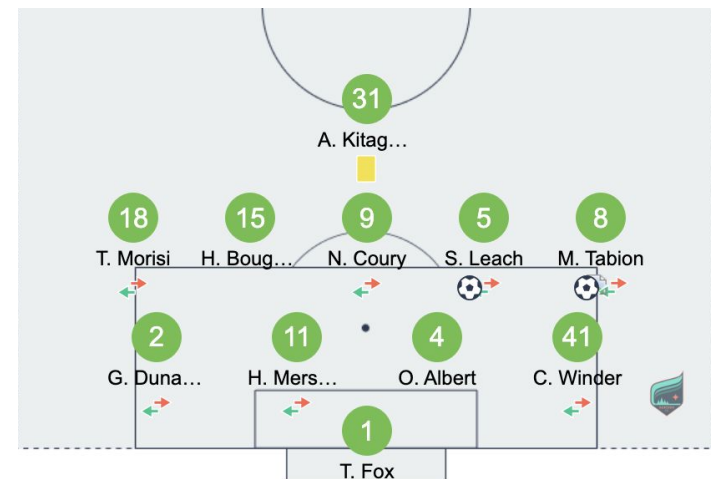

Blank Space

Thanks to their clean sheet victory against Sioux Falls City Wednesday night, Aurora earned its 12th clean sheet in the last 13 matches, dating back to 2025.

The shutout also helped Aurora extend the club record for consecutive clean sheets kept (9).

Midwest State of Mind

Through eight match days, Aurora finds itself near the top of the Central Conference in a number of categories: 1st in goals (29), 1st in goals against (0) and 2nd in shots on target (74).

Aurora aren't just lighting up the conference leaderboard, either. Entering the week, Aurora are the only team remaining in the USL W League that has yet to concede a goal.

Pitch Perfect

Aurora enters their ninth match of 2026 as one of only six perfect teams in the W League, yet to suffer a loss or play to a draw.

All Ai's on Me

Since debuting for Aurora back in late May, Ai Kitagawa continues to turn heads in the W League, entering the week tied for the Golden Boot lead.

With a brace against Rally Madison, Kitagawa became the 4th player in club history with multiple multi-goal matches, joining Morgan Turner (2022), Maya Hansen (2022-2024) and Cat Rapp (2022-2025).

Brighter Together

Aurora's high-octane attack is no stranger to multi-goal matches, having scored at least 2 goals in a match 49 times in club history.

2026 has been no exception: Aurora have scored at least 2 goals in seven of nine matches to start the year, having scored at least 5 goals on three occasions.

One Win is All it Takes

With a win Saturday, Aurora officially clinches the 2026 Heartland Division title, and with it, a playoff berth. It would mark a fifth straight division title, a feat no other club has achieved.

For Club and Country

Aurora's success to open 2026 extends beyond the W League; it's happening on the international level, too.

In May, Skye Leach was called up to the Philippines' Women's National Team for their May camp window. Meanwhile, Talia Coury was called to Mexico's U23 Women's National Team.

It marks the second time in Aurora history multiple players have been called into international duty within the same season

Do You Want the House Tour?

Aurora enters the weekend outright winners of 16 of their last 17 regular season home matches, since the start of 2023, taking 49 of a possible 51 points in that stretch.

In 29 all-time home regular season fixtures, Aurora is 27-0-2, having scored at least 2 goals 26 times and keeping a clean sheet in 18 matches. Over the last 1,080 minutes played at TCO overall, Aurora have only allowed 2 total goals.

For Community. By Community.

Minnesota Aurora was founded by a group of Twin Cities residents and announced in June 2021 as a founding member of the new USL W League, which serves as the country's premier pre-professional league developing the next generation of women's talent, both on and off the field.

The USL W League is made up of the very best amateur and aspiring professional players in the country. Our team features top college players, as well as women playing professionally overseas who are looking for a way to grow their game.

The team's initial community ownership campaign in 2021 raised \$1 million from 3080 community investors from 48 states and several countries. Those investors chose the team name and crest, and they have two representatives on the team's governing board.

In 2024, Aurora launched a second community ownership campaign, which raised an additional \$850,000 from 2,257 new owners. The second campaign's success officially made Aurora the largest community-owned women's soccer club in the United States.

Since 2022, Aurora has set attendance records in the USLW averaging over 5300 fans per game at its home TCO Stadium at Viking Lakes. The team has never lost a regular season match and has won the Heartland Division in each of the last four seasons.

Aurora FC: A Pathway to the Pros

Starting with the club's first-ever player to turn pro – Morgan Turner – in 2022, Minnesota Aurora FC has become a consistent producer of professional soccer talent, both domestically and across the globe.

Since the club's inaugural season, 23 Aurora FC alumnae have gone on to sign professional contracts, including a club-record 9 players from the 2025 roster.

The Aurora badge has been represented by its former players in 16 countries, including the United States, where five Aurora FC players have gone on to complete the USL's professional pathway by signing contracts with USL Super League clubs. Of those five, four are currently active in the league, while three call themselves teammates once again (Charley Boone, Cat Rapp, Maya Hansen).

In 2024, Aurora had its first player selected in a professional draft, when the Portland Thorns of the National Women's Soccer League (NWSL) selected Kelsey Kaufusi 25th overall.

Two former Aurora players have gone on to join NWSL rosters since finishing their time in Eagan: Kaufusi and goalkeeper Nadia Cooper, who signed with the Houston Dash during the 2025 NWSL season.

Aurora FC has also been represented on the international stage, with Hannah Adler spending the last three seasons with the United States' Beach National Team.

Aurora's professional pathway extends beyond players. In 2025, Spokane Zephyr of the USL Super League named former Aurora FC manager Nicole Lukic as the club's first-ever permanent manager.

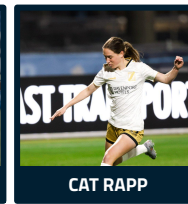

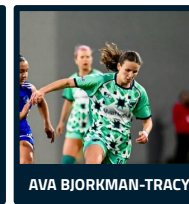

TCO Stadium - Eagan, Minnesota

In 2022, Minnesota Aurora FC announced its partnership with MV Ventures to play all home matches at TCO Stadium in Eagan. Beginning with their inaugural season in May 2022, Aurora has called TCO Stadium home ever since.

The stadium, which is a part of the Vikings Lakes campus and adjacent to the Minnesota Vikings headquarters, provides Minnesota Aurora with a first-class facility for fans and players. The partnership includes full access to the locker rooms, press box, VIP areas, concessions and more than 2,500 parking spaces, plus Twin Cities Orthopedics medical facilities and Training Haus next door.

TCO Stadium seats approximately 5,500 with an ability to expand with temporary seating. On July 1 2023, Aurora set a stadium attendance record of 6,987 fans.
